SITUATION BRIEF

AS AT 06-06-2011 14:00 HRS

GENERAL OVERVIEW:

Extensive rainfall over the past few weeks in Northern Brazil and in particular the state of Rorima have caused the water levels to significantly rise to dangerous levels causing the Rio Bronco, Rio Negro, Takutu and the Ireng Rivers over spill their banks. This has cause millions of gallons of water to inundate more than 60% of neighboring Lethem.

Review of the Situation:

An Emergency Management Operations Center (EMOC) has been established in Central Lethem. This center is manned and is responsible for emergency relief interventions across the region. There is collaboration between the Civil Defense Commission, The Office of the Prime Minister, The Office of the Regional Executive Officer, The Ministry of Public Works, Remote Areas Medical and Guyana Red Cross. Currently the EMOC has fully deployed all of their assets and staff for immediate intervention.

Roads: Contractor DTL and MMC to restore damaged sections of road between Kurupukari and Annai. Pirara bridge is covered with water request is made for the shuttle service at Pirara to continue with tractor and boat.

Bridges:

- (a) Mr. Cyril king along with two other teams is working on restoring 4 damaged bridges.
- (b) On access to Deep South Rupununi approach to two bridges collapsed. (Araquai Bridge and Kabanawau Bridge)
- (c) Najah bridge washed away.

Culverts: Until water recede then culverts will be assessed.

Government Buildings: All Government buildings are being used as a shelter e.g. Amerindian Hostel, R# 22, R# 37 and Nurses Hostel.

Air Strips: Lethem Airstrip is operable but the Apron is flooded, vehicles trespassing the airstrip need to be monitored. All airstrips are operable except Bashaidrun and Sand Creek main airstrip. RAM has a fuel supply that can last for 10 hours trips.

UTILITIES:

GT&T: Water level is still high; they continue to pump out water, equipment still in operation.

DIGICEL: is not being affected because they are on high lands.

LPC: Powers restored from 19:30 hrs on the 5th June, 2011, small transformer was relocated, the station continues to be under 4ft of water, power generation will continue for 16 hrs per day. 26 drums of fuel to last for approximately 4 days.

GWI: Providing water to half of the network which is the Central Lethem, Culvert City is currently without potable water; water is being provided from 5am to 8:30 am using 15 gallons of gasoline pumping 63,000 gallons of water.
